The Church of Ireland congregation of Rossorry Parish Church, Enniskillen, Co. Fermanagh, is again joining with the Roman Catholic congregation which meets in the Graan Monastery, just outside Enniskillen, for an ecumenical event.

It has been reported in "The Impartial Reporter" of 5th April, 2012, that these two congregations plan to march behind a cross from the Graan Monastery to Rossorry Parish Church after a "passion drama presentation" at the Graan. It is supposedly to mark Easter and remember the "Lord's crucifixion and death."

In "The Fermanagh Herald", which is also published in Enniskillen and which chiefly serves the Roman Catholic community, there is an advert carried by 'The Graan' monastery which aptly illustrates the "Christianity" of that establishment and also just what it is with which the Church of Ireland parish of Rossorry is uniting.

One week after "uniting" with the parishioners of Rossorry Parish, it is back to the practice of the true creed of Romanism!

Churches walk behind Cross

TWO churches are coming together to mark Good Friday.

A passion drama presentation will be staged in the Graan at 7pm tomorrow (Friday evening) after which a members of the congregations of both the Graan and Rossorry Parish Church will walk behind a Cross the short distance to Rossorry Church, where a devotional service of music and readings, entitled, "The Cross of Christ" will be held at 8pm.

Transport is being provided at both Rossorry Church at 6.30pm and afterwards back to the Graan.

This weekend, churches throughout the country will be marking Easter on Good Friday and on Easter Sunday.

A spokesman for Rossorry and the Graan said they would be joining with millions of Christians throughout the world who will walk the way of the Cross on Good Friday, remembering their Lord's crucifixion and death.

The doctrinal basis of the Church of Ireland is set forth in the 39 Articles. The very spirit and word of the Articles utterly repudiate all that Rome teaches. Here is just one example.

Article 22. Of Purgatory.

The Romish Doctrine concerning Purgatory, Pardons, Worshipping and Adoration, as well of Images as of Relics, and also Invocation of Saints, is a fond thing, vainly invented, and grounded upon no warranty of Scripture, but rather repugnant to the Word of God.



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Here is another example:

Article 28. Of the Lord's Supper.

The Supper of the Lord is not only a sign of the love that Christians ought to have among themselves one to another, but rather it is a Sacrament of our Redemption by Christ's death: insomuch that to such as rightly, worthily, and with faith, receive the same, the Bread which we break is a partaking of the Body of Christ; and likewise the Cup of Blessing is a partaking of the Blood of Christ.

Transubstantiation (or the change of the substance of Bread and Wine) in the Supper of the Lord, cannot be proved by Holy Writ; but is repugnant to the plain words of Scripture, overthroweth the nature of a Sacrament, and hath given occasion to many superstitions.

The Body of Christ is given, taken, and eaten, in the Supper, only after an heavenly and spiritual manner. And the means whereby the Body of Christ is received and eaten in the Supper, is Faith.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was not by Christ's ordinance reserved, carried about, lifted up, or worshipped.

Led astray

The parishioners of Rossorry are being led back to the darkness and idolatry of pre-Reformation days and that in defiance of their own Articles of Faith and above all, in defiance of God's Holy Word. What a sad testimony to the state of the Church of Ireland!

"To the law and to the testimony: if they speak not according to this word, it is because there is no light in them," Isaiah 8:20, KJV.
