London Free Presbyterian Extension Work Commences Morning Service

Our extension work in London has now commenced a morning service in Walthamstow. The first morning meeting was held on 8th November with Dr Paisley as the guest preacher. He spoke on the Crown of Thorns and showed the greatness of Christ's sufferings as He paid the price for His people's sins. Dr Paisley was accompanied by his wife and our small fellowship was delighted to have the encouragement of their presence and the faithful preaching of God's servant. For this special meeting many supporters of Dr Paisley together with a few local people came along and our numbers were swollen to around fifty. Incidentally, we hope no one gets the impression that this is our regular attendance. We trust it will be one day

but there is a long way to go yet.

For those who may be able to join us at one of our Sunday services, we meet on Lord's Day mornings in Brandon Hall in Stocksfield Road, Walthamstow, E17 at 11.00 am and in the YMCA in Errol Street EC1 at 3.30 pm. Brandon Hall is easily accessible by public transport. The nearest rail station is Wood Street, Walthamstow. It is about a twenty minute journey from Liverpool Street station and one stop from Walthamstow Central tube and BR station. Coming out of Wood Street station you turn right and then take the first road on the right. When you reach the top of this road turn left and keep walking (about 300 yds) until you reach Brandon Hall.

The YMCA in Errol Street is about a 10 minute walk from Barbican Underground Station. When you come out of the station, cross the road and go straight ahead until you reach Whitecross Street. Turn left and walk approx 150 yds. On your right you will see Errol Street. The YMCA is on the right.
