At AS level, Rebekah Ferguson had 3A grades and 1 B grade. At A level, Stephen Crawford had 3A grades. He is at university studying law. Melissa Daly has entered nursing having obtained A, C and D grades.

These results are very commendable indeed and the teachers in our school will take great encouragement from them.
