The Loggerhead Turtle

Creation ... The Preacher With Many Sermons

The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament sheweth his handywork. Day unto day uttereth speech, and night unto night sheweth knowledge. There is no speech nor language, where their voice is not heard, Psalm 19:1-3.

The life cycle of the loggerhead turtle is illustrative of the spiritual dangers that beset the human race. This large creature, weighing about 500 pounds, encounters many enemies especially in its early years.

EGGS LAID

The life cycle begins when a female turtle laboriously drags herself up the beach on a Caribbean island in the late spring or late summer. At a spot well above the high water mark she begins scooping out a hole in which to lay her 200 eggs. She will then cover them with the sand she dug out and leave the area as if it had never been disturbed. Those who have observed this night-time activity have said that the turtle appears to be crying, as if she was aware of the struggle her off-spring would face. The tears are in fact a protective measure to wash the sand out of the turtle's eyes as she digs.

INTENDED VICTIM
