Death of Cardinal Hume.



The late Cardinal Hume

Cardinal Basil Hume, confidant of the Royal family and closely linked to the Prime Minister, Tony Blair, died in June of this year. His was the user-friendly face of Romanism! Praying before the crucifix



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"I think the Crucifix is a great help to prayer. You look and look, and if you are suffering as Jesus did, then that looking will help you understand something about Our Lord, and something about yourself. It gives up its secret. Those are things you cannot write about, things you cannot talk about. Those are things you have to experience. Pray with your eyes in times of stress, no words, no thoughts, just look at the Crucifix. Then take out your rosary and kiss the Crucifix. That is a marvellous prayer."

Faith in the Real Presence and Mary

"We need in our day to affirm our faith in Jesus Christ, true God and true man, and there is another faith which follows from that: our faith in the presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament - Christ wholly present, body, soul and divinity. Prayer to Our Lady can deepen our faith in Jesus Christ her Son and His presence in the Eucharist. Ask for that grace, because when we are touched in our faith in Christ and His presence in the Eucharist, that has an effect on the whole life of the Church, far beyond our own personal faith." Nice man he may well have been but simple believer in the merits of Christ alone for salvation he was not. His own words make that abundantly clear. Rome and Romanists are still far removed from the simple truth of God in Christ Jesus.
