Police suspect subordinates of Education Minister, Martin McGuinness, of robbery

Police are investigating an armed robbery in Dunmurry on the outskirts of Belfast. In a television news broadcast it was stated that it was believed that the IRA was involved. Martin McGuinness is the much publicised “Chief of Staff” of the IRA. At 3.00 am on Wednesday morning up to 12 masked men, armed with a number of handguns, forced their way into the premises in the Kilwie Estate at Upper Dunmurry Lane in Dunmurry.

They tied up a number of staff and locked them in a van. They later managed to free themselves and there were no serious injuries. The robbers removed a large number of electrical goods, washing machines, freezers, clothing, cosmetics and 3000 bottles of red and white wine. Police reports say eight vehicles used to transport the items were later found in West Belfast and Boucher Place. A Skania lorry and a Mercedes lorry were still outstanding. Later, one of these was found abandoned and empty in Co. Monaghan in the Irish Republic.
