Following in father's footsteps!



The Vice-Chairman for the Franklin Graham Festival in Lubbock, Texas, April 28-30, was Paul Key, evangelism director for the Catholic Diocese of Lubbock. At least three of the local leaders of the "festival" are Charismatics.

Paul Key was a Presbyterian minister for 18 years before converting to Catholicism. He has written a book entitled: "95 Reasons for Becoming and Remaining a Catholic."

Not only is Franklin Graham continuing in his ecumenical father's footsteps, but he is moving even farther in the direction of the world. He calls his meetings "festivals" instead of crusades. Each meeting includes "Christian" rock concerts for the youth. The wholesale participation of Southern Baptist churches in the Graham meetings is irrefutable evidence that they are New Evangelical and worldly at best.

Pastor E.L. Bynum, who pastors the Tabernacle Baptist Church in Lubbock, observes: "D.L. Lowrie, pastor of First Baptist Church, and all the other Southern Baptists are lined up in support. . . . I know that at least one Baptist Church that calls itself independent is lined up with them. I refer to College Heights Baptist Church, which was founded by one of the soundest Baptist preachers ever to grace a pulpit in Lubbock. It doesn't take long for a Baptist Church to go apostate, when the sound pastor is gone."
